











NEW DANVILLE: A RURAL NONPROFIT COMMUNITY FOR ADULTS WITH INTELLECTUAL AND DEVELOPMENTAL DISABILITIES

IMPACTS AND OUTCOMES

Residents

We currently have 34 residents with a waiting list of 37. The addition of 15 independent living residences will add 47 openings.

Assisted Living Residents

Assisted living facilities for 12 (six men and six women) are a high priority because of the dearth of options in the area and the revenue that would be generated. Rice University MBA students identified assisted living as a top priority for New Danville in a capstone project.

Day Program Registrants

Additional facilities and amenities will attract new day program participants. Our goal is to grow by 50% to 150 by the end of 2025.

Outdoor Activities

Wranglers and residents will benefit from two pocket parks, an entry park, outdoor exercise equipment, trails and walkways, all of which encourage more time outside.

Socialization

A new community/rec center and other site improvements will provide new opportunities for Wranglers and residents to gather in groups, large and small, for social activities and various events.

Revenue

It is imperative to develop a financial base that includes various revenue streams as well as strategic fundraising. The *Growing...for Living* initiative will create the financial strength to service those in need in the future.





Beauty

Access to, and appreciation of, natural beauty brings a multitude of benefits. All the proposed changes will enhance, not diminish, the beauty of New Danville's unique, ranch-like natural beauty.

As the region grows, so, too, will the need for programs and housing for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities, and those who need similar service. ASSISTED LIVING



There are few assisted living facilities in Texas for adults with special needs and none in New Danville's service area. Our plan calls for beginning with two buildings, one that will be home to six men and the other will be home for six women. Expectation is that we will achieve 100% occupancy very quickly.



Large enough to be efficient for assisted living and small enough to provide a homey environment, the first-ever such facilities at New Danville will provide around-the-clock full service for special needs adults and those needing similar services.

Individual bedrooms will provide an important sense of personal space, while comfortable social areas provide for socialization with other residents or visitors. Common spaces include kitchen, dining area, living room and external seating areas.

Socialization, fitness and opportunities to gather in community are critical to the needs of day program participants and residents at New Danville. Expanding opportunities for life experiences requires a flexible, multiuse space for exercise, social gatherings and events, dining, and more. The community/recreational center space will provide those opportunities as well as jobs for clients.

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This facility will become a hub of activities that are part of day programming as well as a gathering space for residents after hours and on weekends. Providing indoor basketball half -courts, a fitness area, a serving kitchen and café, as well as welcoming gathering spaces, the building will quickly become a favorite for day program attendees and residents.

The building will also provide several part-time jobs for clients to help maintain operations.

Key to New Danville success in empowering others is providing a variety of classes and programs with low instructor-toclient ratios. As day habilitation enrollment continues to climb toward our 2025 goal of 150, additional classroom space is needed. The new classroom building will add six classrooms, one of which will be specially configured for computer and technology classes.



Classrooms will be adaptable to our clients' needs while providing a lessdistracting environment that encourages learning and engagement.


